When it comes to case shapes and designs, Cartier has always led from the front. The iconic Tank is a testament to this with many variation available. One model really stands apart from the crowd, the aptly named Tank Asymétrique, which was launched in 1936. The '30s was a time of profound fecundity for Louis Cartier and in that period the Asymétrique saw light, to suit the needs of drivers. Everything you need to know about this watch

is in its name: the case is asymmetric, and consequently, so is the dial, which changes the whole dynamic. The 12 o'clock is now in the top right-hand corner, the crown is at 2 o'clock, it's all a bit strange, but when your hands are on a steering wheel at ten and two o'clock, the dial is oriented upright. The example here offered is surely one of the rarest and definitely important that can be offered. Powered by a Le Coultre movement, the yellow-gold case is absolutely well preserved, still offering crisp and deep engravings and hallmarks on the back. The dial is simply phenomenal: it is very hard to find an Asymmetric this old with a black dial and almost impossible with the precious signature Jaeger on it. This model was later rechristened the Tank Asymétrique and became one of the most coveted and recognizable timepieces thanks to its total originality in design, but when compared to such a magnificent example, it is immediately clear that vintage times were a step ahead. A small but significant supplement: this specific watch is published in Sandro Fratini's Book "My Time" at page 405.



At the beginning of the '50s, the famous airline company Pan Am was looking for a small instrument which could allow the pilots to keep track of time in two locations. Therefore, in 1954 was presented the first GMT model, reference 6542, and after only 5 years later in the light of the success of this model the reference 1675 was presented, which remained in production until 1980. Reference 16750 followed in 1981 introducing the quick set feature and a new higher beat caliber 3075 movement.











With this update the order of the hands changed from GMT/Hour/ Minute/second on to Hour/GMT/Minute/Second. The lot offered here is a beautiful specimen of 1675, it comes with the unusual but really fascinating totally black bezel and the classical 39 mm tonneau shaped case in stainless steel. The black matte dial features very nice painted indexes and hands and matches with the bezel. The Rolex Turn-O-Graph holds a special place in the history of Rolex as one of the brand's pioneering models featuring a rotating bezel, initially introduced in the early 1950s. This vintage 1940s watch represents a rare collaboration between Movado and Cartier, two icons of luxury watchmaking. Movado, founded in 1881, is renowned for its innovative designs and advanced technologies, often collaborating with other prestigious brands to create unique pieces. The Movado made for Cartier, reference 49 020, is a yellow-gold chronograph with a manual movement. The refined cream-colored dial features Breguet numerals that add a touch of classic elegance.



Rolex introduced the first Daytona in 1963, named in honor of the renowned Daytona Speedway in Florida. The inaugural reference was the 6239, initially equipped with a caliber 72B, later updated to the 722. In 1965, just two years after the 6239's debut, Rolex launched the 6241. This model shared much of its predecessor's design but featured a distinctive black acrylic bezel insert with the tachometer scale printed in white. Available in stainless steel, 14k, and 18k gold, the 6241 remained in production until 1969. It was equipped with non-Oyster inscription, non-screw down chronograph buttons and offered a variety of dials, including silver, black, and at an additional cost, the exotic format dial. The particular Rolex 6241 presented here is crafted in 14k yellow gold and boasts a three-body case that is remarkably well-preserved. The untouched acrylic bezel complements the pristine black dial, which is adorned with applied baton numerals, ocher luminous dots, and the rare Everose subsidiary counters. Additionally, this watch comes with its original 14k gold bracelet from the era, further enhancing its desirability for collectors. The preservation of this specimen, including the bracelet, makes it a unique and valuable piece in the history of the Rolex Daytona collection.

The Rolex Submariner has become an enduring icon, revered by collectors for its timeless design and groundbreaking innovation since its debut in 1953. The Rolex Prince is a model that laid the foundation for Rolex's ascent in the watchmaking world. The Patek Philippe reference 2497 stands as one of the most historically significant and revered timepieces ever created by the brand, produced from 1951 until its discontinuation in 1963. 

The here offered timepiece from the 1950s is a striking example of how watches of the era could defy conventions. At a time when smaller watches were the norm, this reference 8029, produced in 1951, is an exceptional rarity due to its unusually large 38 mm steel case, a notable deviation from the typical post-WWII luxury watch standards. The watch offered here represents Patek Philippe at its purest: the iconic reference 3448, introduced in 1962, which stands as the world's first self-winding perpetual calendar wristwatch with a moon phase. 





Rolex Reference 3330 is an iconic Antimagnetic chronograph from the late 1930s, often referred to as a "Pre-Oyster" chronograph because it predates the introduction of Rolex's iconic Oyster case. Measuring a generous 37 mm, the timepiece is considered one of the rarest and largest pre-Oyster Rolex chronographs ever produced by the firm. The reference 3330 was



ahead of its time, featuring an innovative design more typical of today's market. This partnership ended in 1997 with the disappearance of the Cravanzola name. The scarcity of Reference 3330, combined with the special signature on the dial and the fact that it represents an early stage in Rolex's development of chronographs, makes it a prized piece in vintage watch collections.

Production of these watches began in 1920, following specific requests from Gondolo & Labouriau, with ebauche manufactured around the 1910's with features such as a cam wheel regulator for precise adjustments, a mustache-shaped lever, wolf tooth winding gears, and gold wheels for the train. These high-grade movements were then housed in a variety of case sizes and shapes. Given its historical significance, aesthetic appeal, and rarity, this wristwatch stands as a true trophy piece.

The legendary Heuer Monaco was first released in 1969, making an immediate impact in the industry as the first self-winding chronograph and the first one to feature an iconic squareshaped case. 

In 1989, before commemorative anniversary models became commonplace, Patek Philippe didn't just celebrate an anniversary—it honored a legacy. To mark its 150th year, the brand unveiled a collection of timepieces that were not merely limited editions but symbols of its enduring brilliance: true masterpieces, rare and breathtaking in their complexity. Among these exceptional creations were the monumental Caliber 89 and two remarkable minute repeaters: the Ref. 3974, with its perpetual calendar, and the Ref. 3979—an embodiment of pure horological art. As Patek's first self-winding minute repeater, the Ref. 3979 represented a leap forward for the brand, encapsulating over a century of innovation and timeless elegance. It embodies

refined elegance and minimalism, highlighting Patek Philippe's unparalleled expertise in crafting high complications. Despite its intricate mechanics, the watch maintains a timeless and understated design, seamlessly blending tradition with modern innovation. Encased in a sleek 33 mm round case with architecturally inspired lugs reminiscent of vintage Patek Philippe minute repeaters, this reference was offered in platinum, white gold, pink gold, and yellow gold. The Omega Speedmaster Apollo XI model, reference 145 022, is a chronograph crafted in yellow gold, released to commemorate the historic moon landing. A total of 1014 units were produced, with the first and second examples intended for President Nixon and Vice-President Spiro Agnew of the United States. However,



due to compliance reasons, these were declined and now reside in the Omega Museum. The initial 32 pieces were presented at a gala dinner in Houston to mission astronauts, each engraved with "To Mark Man's Conquest of Space with Time, Through Time, on Time." The remaining watches were sold to the general public, and like the present example, number 718, they feature an engraved back reading, "Omega Speedmaster - Apollo XI 1969 - The First Watch Worn on the Moon." There are three variations of the engraving: thin and unpainted for approximately the first 100 examples, then thick and unpainted, and finally thick and painted in burgundy, matching the burgundy-colored bezel. This particular watch belongs to the latter category, with thick painted lettering. The 145022 is highly appealing with its gold dial, onyx numerals, and distinctive burgundy bezel. The present lot is offered in remarkable overall condition and is further enhanced by the inclusion of its extract from the Archives directly from Omega, with all the informations registered on it.

The Rolex reference 3055, produced initially in the 1930s and reintroduced in the 1950s, is a remarkable piece, notable for its entirely novel case design compared to earlier models. The black gilt dial, adorned with applied pink gold baton and dot numerals, features subsidiary seconds at 9 o'clock and a half-instantaneous 30-minute recorder with a subsidiary dial at 3 o'clock. 

Cartier and platinum have a storied relationship that dates back to the early 20th century. In 1985, amid the guartz crisis, IWC embarked on an ambitious journey to create its first grande complication wristwatch, resulting in one of the world's most complicated timepieces: a wristwatch featuring a perpetual calendar, a chronograph, and a minute repeater. The project, a horological masterpiece, was



spearheaded by a team of watchmakers and engineers, including two future luminaries in the watchmaking world: Dominic Renaud and Giulio Papi. 



This is one of the most iconic and recognizable chronographs that came out from Patek Philippe industries: the unmistakable reference 130. The Rolex Daytona reference 6263 is an iconic timepiece that epitomizes the pinnacle of Rolex's storied history in chronograph watchmaking. 


