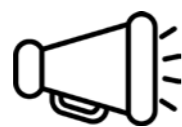

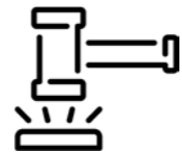

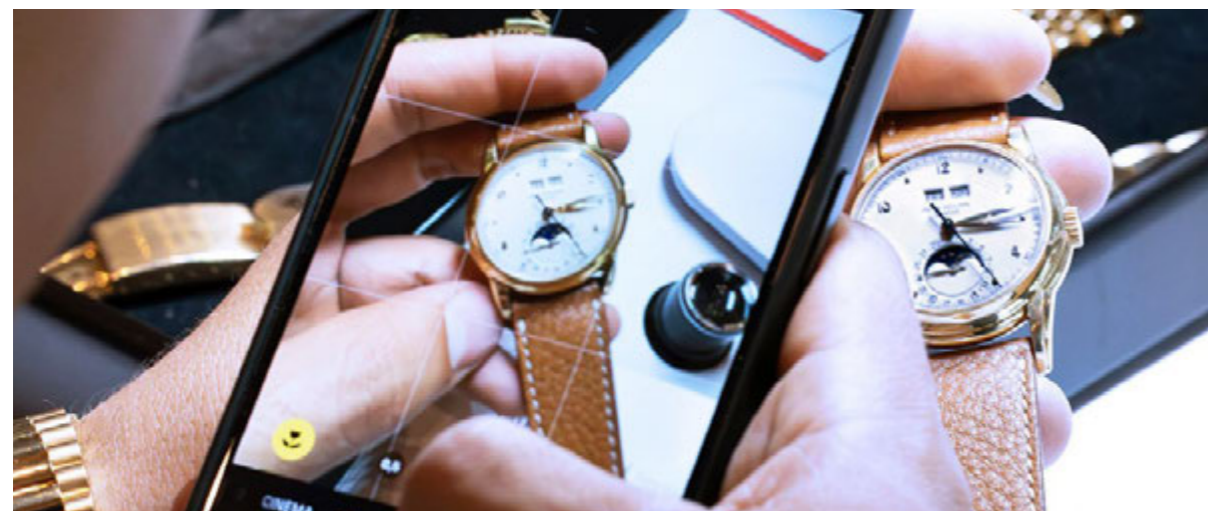

This very attractive Gérald Genta is a rare and innovative creation that reflects the designer's flair for pushing the boundaries of horological design. Crafted entirely in yellow gold, its unique functionality makes it a standout piece in Genta's portfolio. Powered by a quartz movement, this watch is a perfect blend of avant-garde technology and timeless craftsmanship. What sets this watch apart is its ability to display five different time zones simultaneously, an exceptional feature rarely seen in luxury timepieces.

The primary time zone is adjusted via the crown at 3 o'clock, while the four subsidiary dials, each representing a different time zone, are individually set using the pushers discreetly located on the bends of the case. A thoughtful and functional detail is the day-and-night indicator shown into the four subsidiary dials. Featuring sun and moon motifs, these indicators provide a visual cue for whether it is day or night in each respective time zone. This timepiece is a rare find, as Gérald Genta's multi-time-zone watches were produced in very limited numbers and are appreciated by the passionate.

The here offered Gefica in yellow gold is a stunning representation of Genta's bold and imaginative approach to watchmaking. Known for his avant-garde designs and technical innovation, Genta created the Gefica line to merge artistic expression with practical functionality, originally inspired by safari enthusiasts seeking robust yet elegant timepieces. This example, preserved in exceptionally fine condition as evidenced by the well-defined engravings on the case back, is a collector's delight. The

textured charcoal grey dial, likely crafted from a hard stone, is a striking feature: its rough, organic finish contrasts beautifully with the rich warmth of the yellow-gold case. The nautical theme is evident in the decorative flags positioned at 6 o'clock: these maritime elements highlight Genta's knack for integrating storytelling into his designs. One of the most intriguing aspects of this watch is the set of five apertures at the top of the dial spelling out the word "START." While Gérald Genta was known for incorporating retrograde displays and jumping mechanisms into his creations, the exact function of these windows in this particular model might correspond to a timer or chronograph-related complication. Powered by an automatic movement, this Gefica model combines its artistic and nautical elements with technical sophistication.

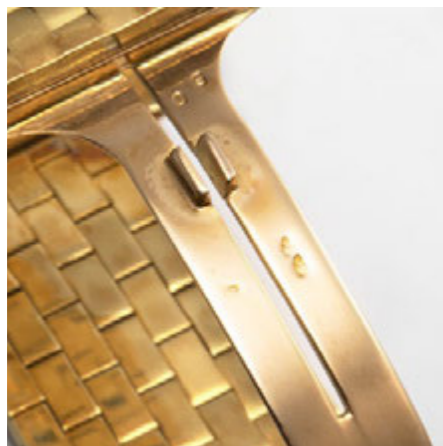
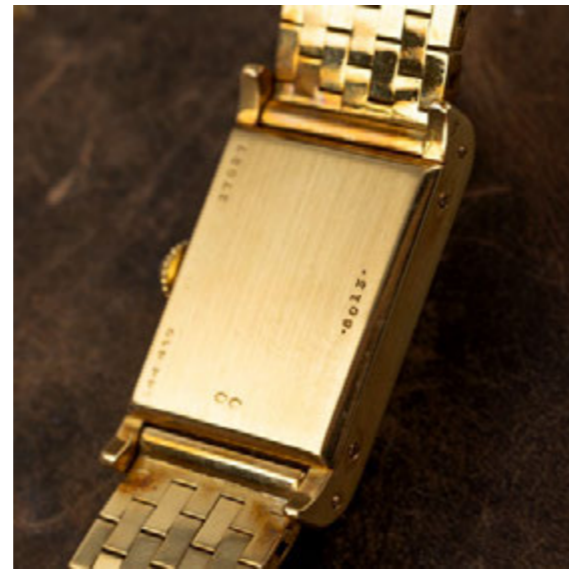

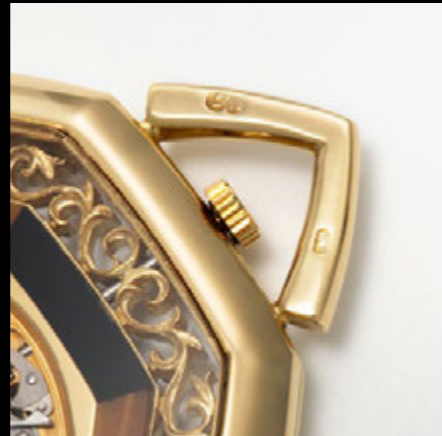

This was the era's most precise movement, achieving an astonishing accuracy of just one second variation per month. A quick press of the pusher allowed for synchronization of the seconds hand, ensuring maximum precision. The rectangular case features an octagonal shape with softer lines, a unique and captivating design choice. The dial is adorned with a "petite tapisserie" pattern in an electric blue hue, complete with a date display at 6 o'clock and baton indexes that match the hands. In superb overall condition, the present example of reference 6001 showcases a slightly tropicalized dial, original certificate, and presentation box.

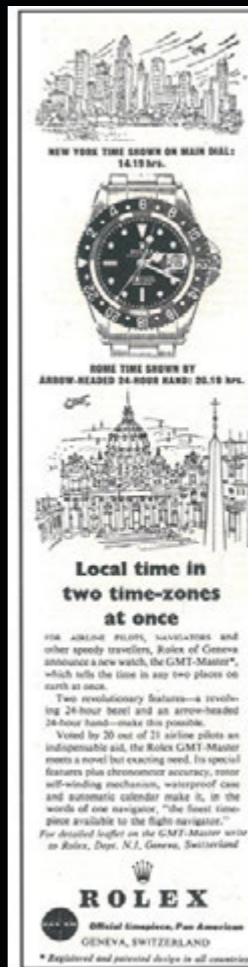

This particular Rolex GMT-Master reference 6542 is a true collector's piece, distinguished not only by its rarity but also by its extraordinary provenance. 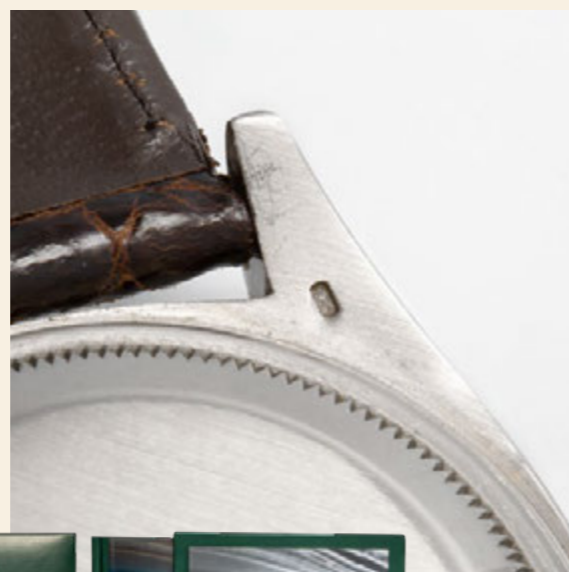
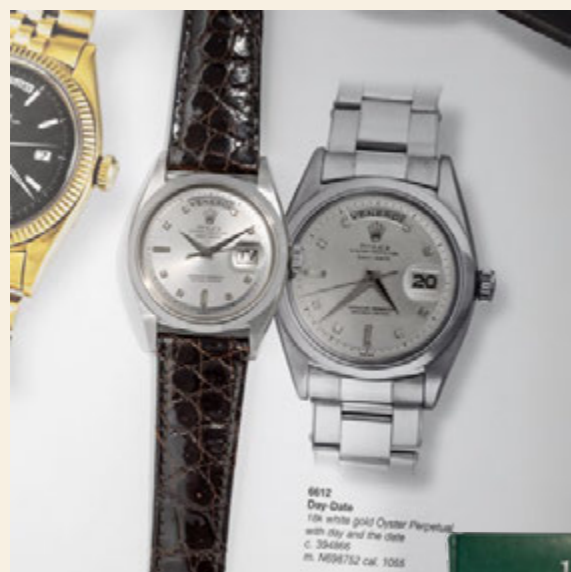

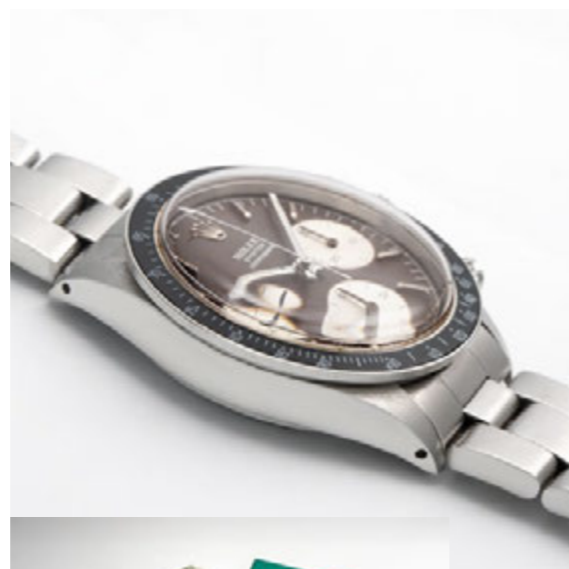

Among the most complex wristwatches ever produced by Rolex, the present example belongs to the prestigious line of Dato-Compax chronographs, a collection that stands as a rare departure from the brand's traditionally utilitarian designs. The Quartz Revolution of the late 1960s and early 1970s significantly transformed the Swiss watchmaking industry, as brands faced stiff competition from Japanese companies mass-producing affordable, battery-powered watches. During the early development of quartz tech-

nology, Patek Philippe, along with other manufacturers such as Rolex, Omega, and Piaget, began exploring quartz movements and collaborated to establish the Centre Electronique Horloger (CEH) in 1962. The CEH introduced the Beta-1 movement in 1966, followed by the revolutionary Beta-21 movement in 1969, which offered remarkable accuracy with a deviation of only five seconds per month. The participating brands collectively agreed to manufacture 6 000 Beta-21 movements to be distributed among the group. The present timepiece, reference 3603-2, also known as “Grande Ellipse” or “Elletrico”, together with references 3587 and 3597 were amongst the largest rectangular wristwatches ever made by Patek Philippe. Available in either yellow or white gold with Ateliers Réunis cases, the dials were made by Stern Frères from massive 18K gold plates. Extremely fascinating, the reference 3603 - “dash two”, such as the present example, is the designation for watches with the “tubogaz” type solid 18K gold bracelet, whilst the 3603 had a leather strap and the 3603-1, was fitted with a “oyster” style bracelet. 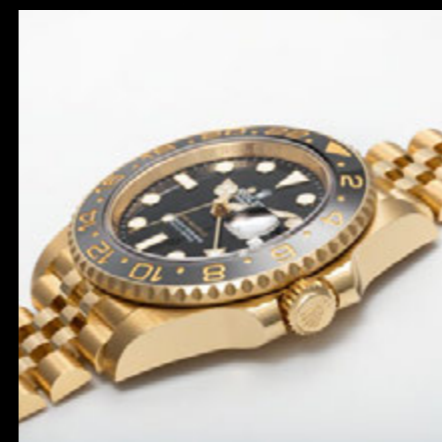

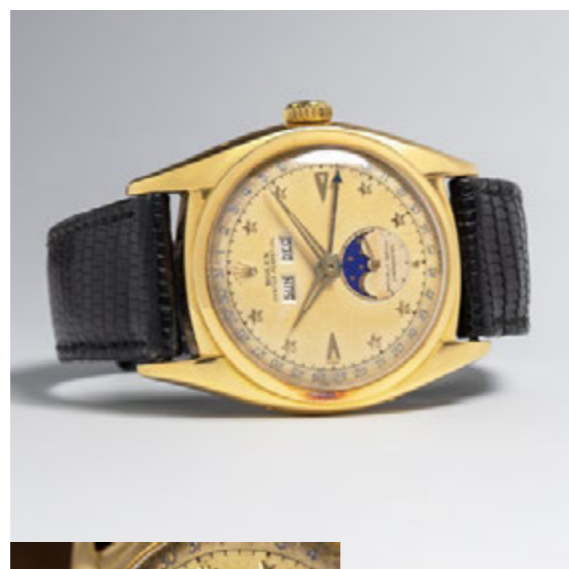

The decision to produce complicated calendar watches was an unusual departure for the brand. Initially met with skepticism in the market, these intricate Rolex watches had limited commercial success, contributing to their

extreme scarcity today. To enhance its appeal and drive sales, Rolex produced the model in three different metals: yellow gold, pink gold, and steel, along with distinct dial variations. The most sought-after and recognizable configuration features star-shaped hour markers, with some versions incorporating luminous material within or beside these markers, earning the watch its affectionate nickname "Stelline," Italian for "little stars." Housed in a refined 36 mm water-resistant "Ovettone"-style case, the reference 6062 was produced for an incredibly short period (approximately 1950 to 1953). Gold Oyster cases, like the present example, were generally produced for Rolex by Genex S.A., while the stainless steel counterparts were made by Spillman. The present example of reference 6062 further distinguishes itself thanks to a gorgeously aged tropical dial. When originally released, the dial likely appeared to have a uniform silver tone. However, with time and natural patina, it has become evident that the dials were actually designed with a subtle two-tone effect, with the central portion featuring a matte ivory grené texture and a lighter-brown ring emerging along the outer dial. The case remains robust, with a rich homogeneous patina, enhancing the watch's vintage charm. Having been in the same prominent collection for the last twenty years, the present timepiece is a remarkable testament to both its enduring desirability and the discerning taste of its caretaker. It is said that "necessity is the mother of invention," and this need, to which Pan Am sought an answer, was satisfied by the usual and unsurpassed genius of Rolex, following the incredible success of the tool watches they began producing in the mid-20th century. In 1954, Rolex introduced the first GMT-Master model, Reference 6542, featuring an instantly recognizable bakelite bezel insert with the twenty-four-hour markings printed on its underside. Just five

years later, in response to the success of this model, Rolex unveiled Reference 1675, which remained in production until 1980 and introduced key modifications to enhance durability and functionality. The fragile bakelite bezel was replaced with an aluminum insert, and crown guards were added for extra protection. The example presented here is a stunning and highly unusual specimen of the 1675, distinguished by its charming milk-chocolate tropical brown dial, which has aged into a warm and captivating hue over time, contrasting beautifully with the faded blue and red/copper-toned bezel. 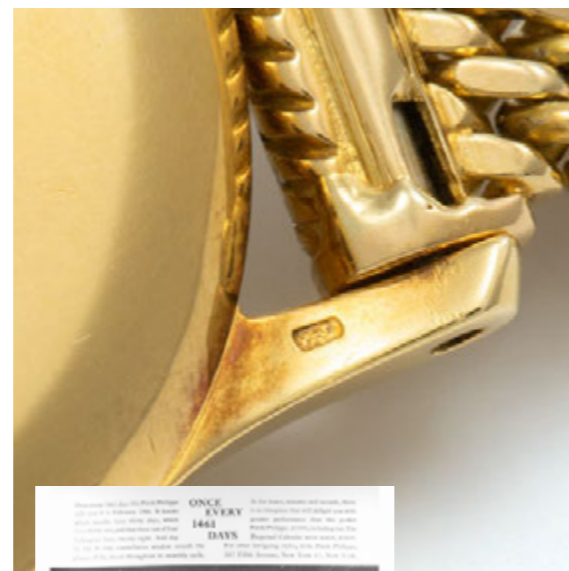

The Quartz Revolution of the late 1960s and early 1970s significantly transformed the Swiss watchmaking industry, as brands faced stiff competition from Japanese companies mass-producing affordable, battery-powered watches. During the early development of quartz tech-

nology, Patek Philippe, along with other manufacturers such as Rolex, Omega, and Piaget, began exploring quartz movements and collaborated to establish the Centre Electronique Horloger (CEH) in 1962. The CEH introduced the Beta-1 movement in 1966, followed by the revolutionary Beta-21 movement in 1969, which offered remarkable accuracy with a deviation of only five seconds per month. The participating brands collectively agreed to manufacture 6 000 Beta-21 movements to be distributed among the group. The present timepiece, reference 3603-1, also known as the "Grande Ellipse" or "Elletrico," together with references 3587 and 3597, were among the largest rectangular wristwatches ever made by Patek Philippe. Available in either white or yellow gold with Ateliers Réunis cases, the dials were made by Stern Frères from a massive 18K gold plate and showcased either blue, gilt, silvered, or browned finishes, like the present example. 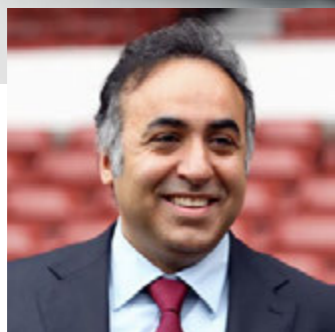
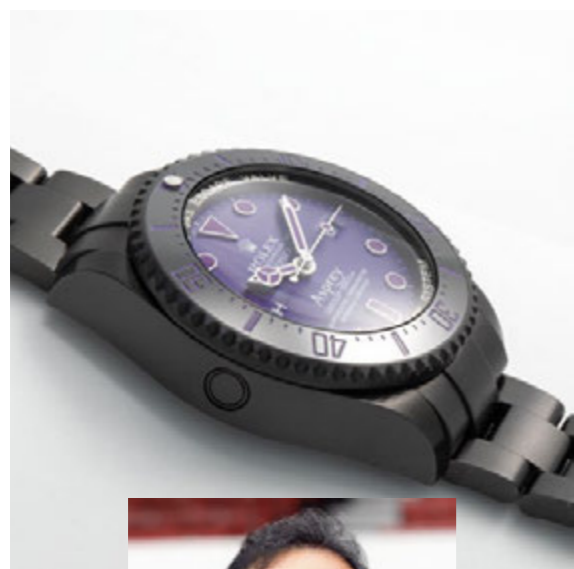

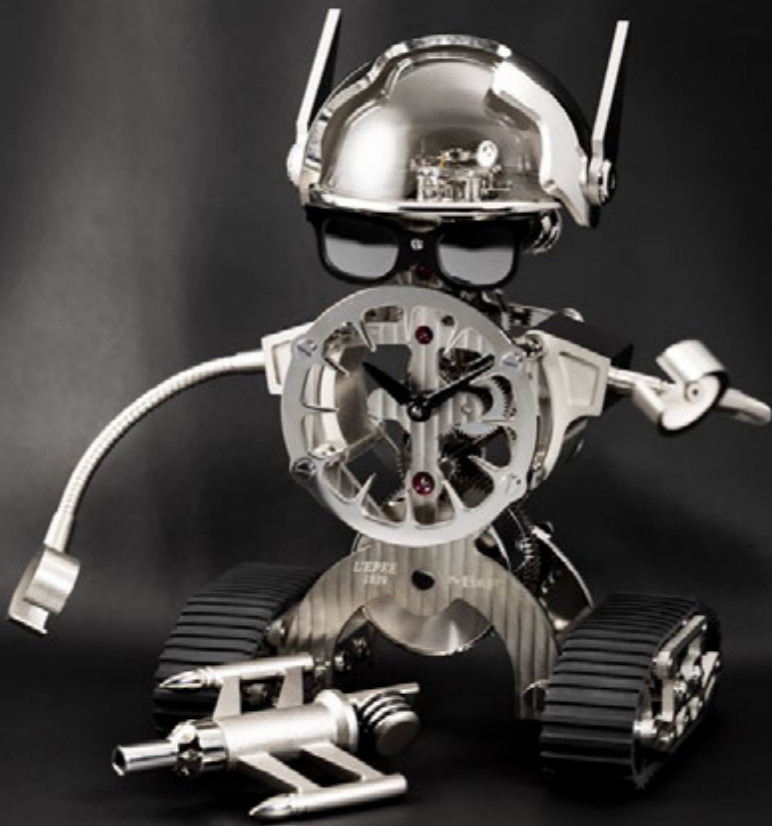

Among the earliest creations of Daniel Roth's independent watchmaking venture, the Perpetual Calendar reference 2117 stands as a landmark timepiece in haute horology. This remarkable and historically significant Breguet pocket watch, designed as an exhibition piece, is surely one of the brand's most intricate creations. A former OSS officer, he was instrumental in negotiating the surrender of German forces in Italy during World War II. His tenure ended in controversy after the Bay of Pigs invasion, leading to his resignation. He later served on the Warren Commission investigating Kennedy's assassination. This extraordinary Breguet blends horological innovation with historical significance, offering collectors a rare opportunity. From the very beginning, Richard Mille's guiding principle was to push the boundaries of innovation by using advanced materials and techniques. In 2001, just one year after launching its first wristwatch, Richard Mille unveiled the RM002, a remarkable blend of engineering and technology. Building on the features of the original model, such as the tourbillon, power reserve, and torque indicators, the RM002 introduced a racing-inspired element with a gear-like function selector. Above it, a transparent crystal showcases automotive-inspired white Arabic numerals, marking both the main time display and function indicators. The perpetual calendar chronograph with moonphase is Patek Philippe's longest-running collection and a fundamental part of the brand's production. All models in this series have been highly collectible, with some regarded as the pinnacle of Patek Philippe craftsmanship. 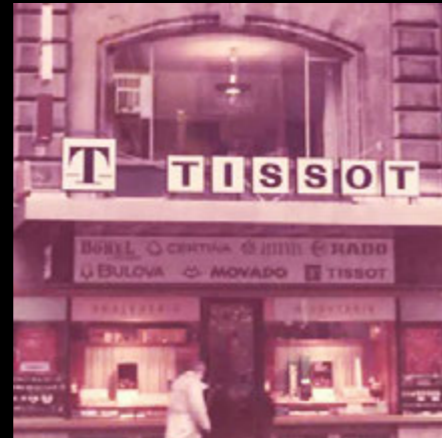

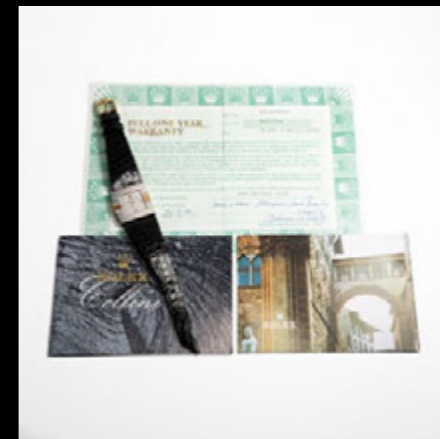

Made in the early 1940s, the “Sistema Magini” pocket and wristwatches played a crucial role in the success of a historic Italian Air Force mission. The origins of the Magini model are tied to a little-known yet fascinating chapter of the Second World-War. By 1942, the Axis Powers suspected that their encrypted radio communications had been compromised by the Allies. In response, the Italian Royal Air Force was tasked with an urgent mission: to deliver new cipher codes directly to their Japanese counterparts. Without the aid of modern GPS, radar, or radio naviga-

tion, the operation relied on celestial navigation, guided by two critical instruments: a Longines Lindbergh Hour Angle watch and a highly specialized Eberhard 24-hour split-seconds chronograph pocket watch, later known as the “Magini”. On June 29, 1942, a squadron of five elite Italian pilots, including navigator Publio Magini, embarked on the perilous journey. After just two stopovers—in Rostov-on-Don, Ukraine, and Bao Tou, China—the mission concluded successfully six days later in Tokyo. The aviators returned home along the same treacherous route, receiving top military honors for their accomplishment. However, the operation remained classified, shrouded in secrecy. Eberhard subsequently received a request for ten more split-seconds chronographs, but these were never supplied to the Royal Air Force as the conflict had come to an end, making the few living examples historically important and unique. Encased in a superb 51 mm stainless steel tripartite case with a snap-on back and concave lugs featuring fixed bars, the Eberhard “Mod. Magini” split-seconds monopusher chronograph boasts a co-axial monopusher integrated into the winding crown, along with a split-seconds function pusher positioned at 2 o’clock. The silver dial, bearing the maker’s signature, features a 24-hour display with Arabic numerals, a date-window at 12 o’clock and a minute track marked in 1/5th-second increments. The hour is indicated by blued Breguet hands, while the minutes are highlighted with gilded counterparts. A similar example of this Modello Magini is housed in the prestigious Eberhard Museum, and the watch offered here represents the only known example potentially available for purchase in the public market today. This makes it an incredibly rare opportunity for collectors who seek the most elusive and sought-after timepieces. Considering its age, historical importance, and uniqueness, it is a true gem for connoisseurs, a piece that no-one knows when will surface again, making it a grail in the world of horology.

The Rolex Explorer II, reference 1655, was introduced in 1971 as a bold and innovative addition to the brand's iconic Explorer line. Made for approximately 20 years, the family of Dato Compax includes references 4767, 5036, 6036, and 6236 and has to be considered a landmark model as it represents the first foray of Rolex into the market of complicated timepieces: offering a chronograph function with triple calendar, there was no other Rolex chronograph model presenting more complications. 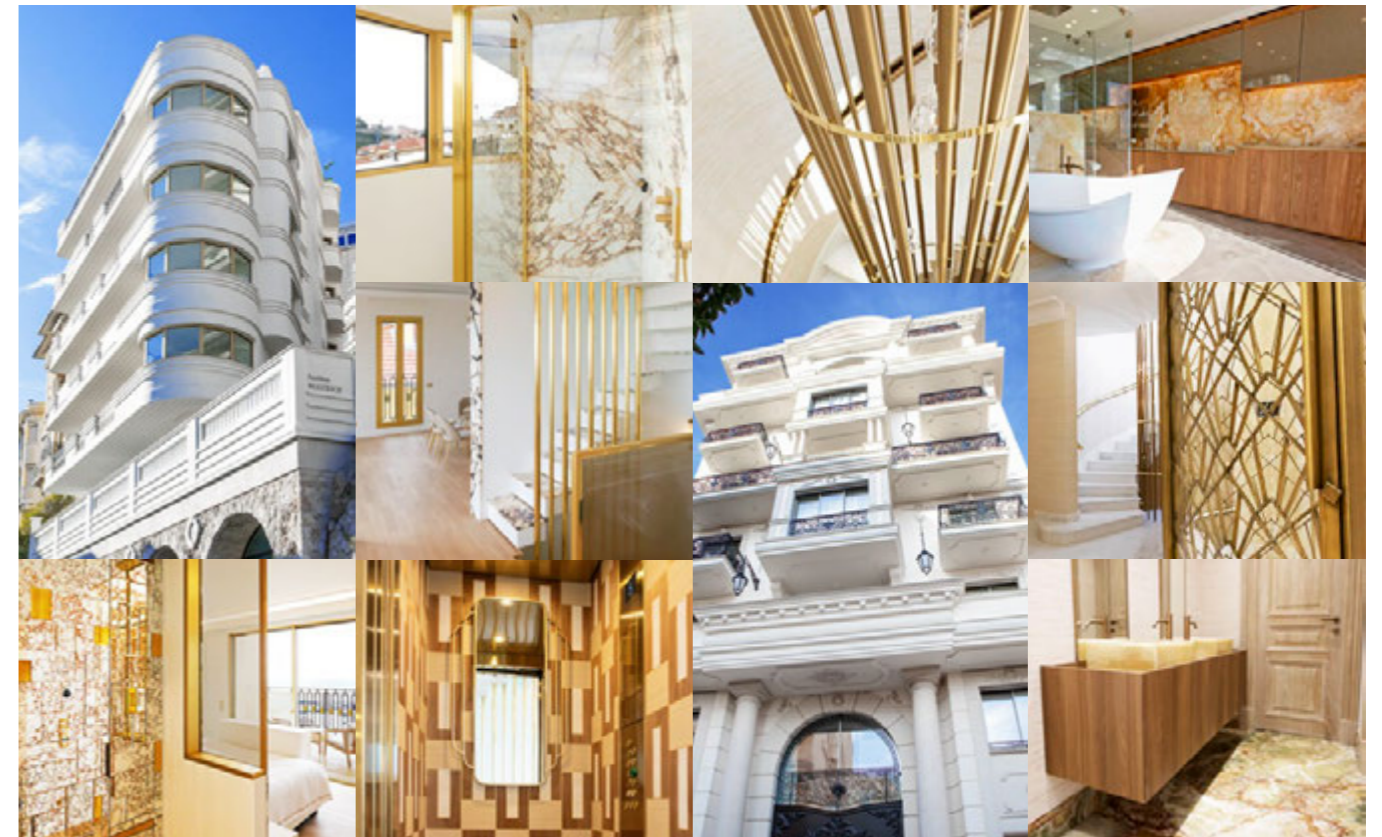
